This year's clinician is **Lisa Hewitt** is the music specialist at Westbrooke Elementary School in Orange County, Florida. She holds a BME from Stetson University/DeLand, FL. Her education also includes post-Level III (Master Class) Orff Schulwerk Teacher Education, and World Drumming Level I. Lisa attended the International Summer Course at the Orff Institut in Salzburg, Austria in 2018 and Spain Orff in Madrid, Spain in 2019. Her responsibilities with the American Orff-Schulwerk Association (AOSA) include attending the annual International Orff Forum Conference in Salzburg where she presented in 2019. Lisa organized and implemented the first All-State Orff Ensemble in the nation as the FMEA All-State Orff Coordinator for the Florida Music Education Association in 2016. After a short sabbatical to take on national work, she was appointed Co-Coordinator of the FMEA All-State Orff Ensemble. Lisa has presented in several states and at the AOSA Professional Development conference.

Registration for the workshop is \$45.00 for MMEA members, \$75.00 for non-members; and \$20.00 for college students. Add \$15.00 for late or on-site registration. Lunch will be own your own. You may preregister for the workshop in your area. Please complete the pre-registration form and return it to the chairperson of the workshop you are planning to attend.
